



## Wildflower Field Guides -- Canada

### Water and Wetland Plants of the Prairie Provinces: A Field Guide for Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and the Northern United States

Heinjo Lahring

Over 400 species of water and wetland plants found across Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and the northern United States are included in this field guide. The book has over 300 colour photographs; over 300 line drawings; scientific names, including synonyms and origins; common names; detailed plant descriptions; habitats and distributions; special features, including traditional uses as food or medicine, and unique or harmful characteristics; comparisons to and descriptions of related species. Since many of the northern wetland plants are circumpolar in distribution, this book will also be useful in other parts of Canada, the United States, and Eurasia.

## *ALBERTA*

### Alberta Wayside Wildflowers

The book features 112 species, organized into five main sections according to flower type. The text provides notes on uses, names and ecology of the plants, blooming times and habitats. The key is a pictorial guide organized by flower colour.

### Plants of Alberta: Trees, Shrubs, Wildflowers, Ferns, Aquatic Plants & Grasses

France Royer, Richard Dickinson

This book covers over 700 primary species and over 300 secondary species of native and naturalized plants in 115 families. It has more than 1,000 colour photos and descriptions with habitat notes, range maps and notations about similar species. The photo keys are to plant types as well as plant families.

### Plants of Kananaskis Country in the Rocky Mountains of Alberta

The field guide includes detailed descriptions of more than 430 native and introduced species, with an extensive overview of the Kananaskis area. Includes nearly 1,000 illustrations, botanical keys, maps, and an illustrated glossary.

Uncommon Beauty: Wildflowers and Flowering Shrubs of Southern Alberta and Southeastern BC

Neil L. Jennings

This book includes photographs of over 200 species of flowering plants, plus information about each plant. The plants are arranged by flower colour and family. The area covered includes Jasper down to Cranston, over to Glacier National Park in Montana, and up to Lethbridge and Edmonton.

Wildflowers of Alberta: A Guide to Common Wildflowers and Other Herbaceous Plants

Kathleen Wilkinson

The guide provides detailed descriptions of more than 250 of Alberta's flowering plant species. It includes photographs, line drawings, and ethnobotanical information. The appendices offer keys to the major families, comparisons of new and old taxonomy, selected references, an alphabetized species index by flower colour, and a species index.

Wildflowers of Calgary and Southern Alberta

France Royer and Richard Dickinson

A field guide with descriptions that accompany colour photographs of more than 100 Alberta species, found from Red Deer to the Montana border, Banff National Park to the Cypress Hills.

Wildflowers of Edmonton and Central Alberta

France Royer and Richard Dickinson

This field guide features common and characteristic species from Jasper National Park to Lloydminster, Fort McMurray to Red Deer.

## ***BRITISH COLUMBIA***

Central Beauty: Wildflowers and Flowering Shrubs of the Southern Interior of British Columbia

Neil L. Jennings

The book explores the wildflowers and flowering shrubs commonly found in the portions of British Columbia typically known as the southern interior very roughly an east/west line drawn through Williams Lake, B.C. The southern limit of the area extends well into the states of Washington, Idaho and Montana.

Coastal Beauty: Wildflowers and Flowering Shrubs of Coastal British Columbia and Vancouver Island

The book includes photographs and information about each plant. Plants are arranged by flower colour and by plant family.

Plants of Southern Interior British Columbia and the Inland Northwest

Robert Parish

This book covers over 675 species of trees, shrubs, wildflowers, grasses, ferns, mosses and lichens commonly found in the region from the crest of the Rockies to the Coast Mountains, including the interior of Washington and Idaho. Species descriptions are combined with drawings and colour photographs for plant identification.

The book features over 100 species, organized into five main sections according to flower type. The notes include uses, names and ecology of the plants, blooming times and habitats. The pictorial guide is organized by flower colour.

***ONTARIO***

Ontario Wildflowers: 101 Wayside Flowers

The ROM Field Guide to Wildflowers of Ontario

Richard Dickinson, Timothy Dickinson and Deborah Metsger

The guide features descriptions of 400 of Ontario's most common wildflowers, including notes on habitat; characteristic features of each species' leaves, flowers, and fruits; description of similar species; and in many cases interesting additional information about the plant, such as traditional uses, origin of its name, and biology. Includes approximately 1,000 colour photographs drawn from the ROM's collection of more than 50,000 botanical photos. Uses a colour-coded key for identification.

## ***SASKATCHEWAN***

### Saskatchewan Wayside Wildflowers

The book features 112 species, organized into five main sections according to flower type. Photographs accompany the plants. The text provides notes on uses, names and ecology of each plant, blooming times and habitats.

## ***YUKON***
